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| NHS at fin   | risk  | A report by the Audit Commission claims that the NHS is at "high financial risk". The report on corporate governance across the public sector singles out the NHS as being the sector most at financial risk because of a combination of high demand for services coupled with failure to address underlying deficits. The financial risk is heightened by targets and poor quality information according to the report. The Audit Commission recommend the adaptation of management tools such as comprehensive performance assessment in order to measure capacity and performance 'in the round'.
