Agenda for change: progress update

A ccording to usually reliable sources, the job descriptions of the healthcare science group of staff within Greater Glasgow have completed the local job matching and consistency checking processes and have now sent to Scottish level for the approval of the national monitoring group. Best estimate is that this group, which is the last major tranche, should be assimilated in March. No information for this gropu of staff is available for the Clyde Division which carries out job matching separately from Glasgow M eanwhile, the current official timetable for assimilation (subject to national monitoring approval) looks like this: Clyde

January: Clinical psychology, health promotion, AHP professional managers and general mop up.

Greater Glasgow

January: General mop up from previously assimilated categories of staff.

February: Clinical psychology, some corporate services and general mop up.

Parental Leave Guidance	The latest guidance from the Acute Services Division can be downloaded from the Branch website: www.amicusglasgowhealth.org/News.htm#Parental%20leave%20guidance Summary Staff are entitled to 4 weeks paid leave and 9 weeks unpaid leave (total 13 weeks, pro rata for part time staff) per child for each parent employed by NHSGG&C Eligibility All staff with children under the age of 14. In cases of adoption – 8 years after placement or 18th birthday. Disabled child – up to 18th birthday. (Must be in receipt of DLA). The paid part of the parental leave provisions are being implemented on a phased basis, with up to two weeks being available from 1st October 2004 sub- ject to strict conditions - see the guidance for full details.

Most of the myths are simply lies. Others are, deliberate or otherwise, misinterpretations of the facts. For example, it would seem unlikely that employers are "risk averse" or "overly cautious" when over one million workers a year suffer injury at work. Equally, the media seem unwilling to publicise the fact that the number of health and safety laws has actually halved in the last thirty five years.
